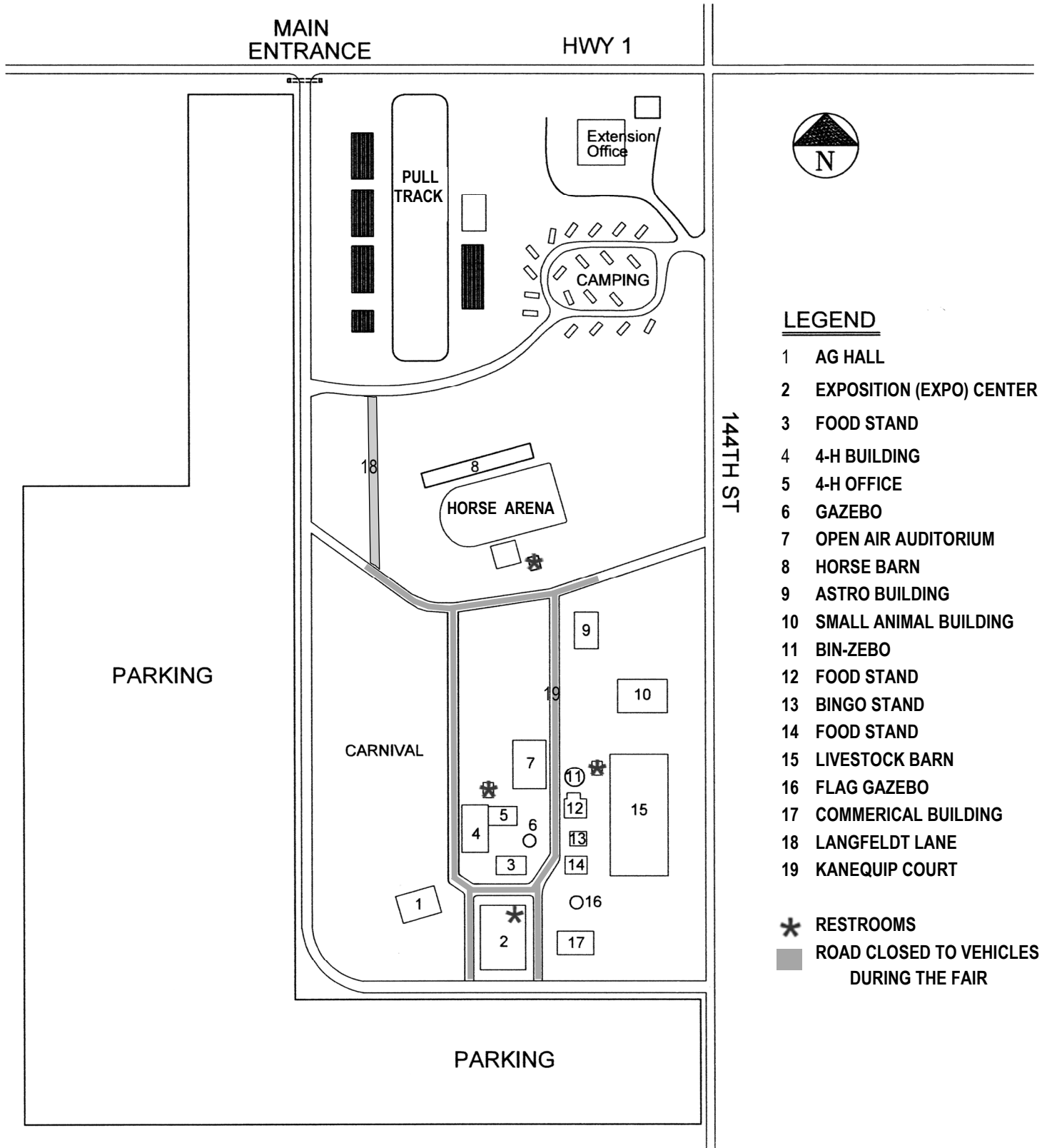

CASS COUNTY FAIR BOARD APPROVED REGULATIONS

GENERAL

- While the greatest possible care will be taken by the management to protect patrons of the Cass County Fair, each individual will be held personally responsible for his or her own actions. The management will not be responsible for any injury.
- All possible diligence or care will be exercised to prevent loss of injury to articles or animals on exhibit, but it is hereby expressly stipulated that the management of the Fair will in no way be responsible should any loss or injury occur.
- Articles that have won premiums in previous years will not be awarded premiums again.
- All entries must be made by the contestant.
- Exhibit animals only on fair grounds! **No pets of any kind are allowed.** Vision-assist animals are exempt with documentation.
- Distribution of promiscuous advertising matter is strictly prohibited.
- NO tacking of advertising matter on buildings will be permitted. Exhibitors may distribute advertising matter from their places of exhibit only.
- No monstrosities or non-approved solicitors will be allowed on the fair grounds.
- ATVs, UTVs, golf carts or other personal motorized vehicles are for fair board use only and are not permitted on the grounds for personal use. Mobility-assist vehicles are allowed with proper documentation.

SHOW ANIMALS

- It is illegal to use drugs not approved by USDA in meat animals.
- No stall in cattle barn will be cleaned during the auction.
- No premiums will be paid for poultry or rabbits if cages are not cleaned at the time they are released. Must be inspected by Superintendent to receive premiums.
- The age of all animals shall be computed from the last day of the month in which they were born.
- No animal or article not listed in premium list will be entered for premium except as otherwise provided.

PROTESTS

- All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$5.00 which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal, and must be filed with the Secretary of the Fair Board by noon of the last day of the Fair. Written protest must include:
 - * Names of persons involved,
 - * Description of the concern,
 - * Documentation of the situation of what occurred,
 - * Recommendation for correction,
 - * Specific action rule, etc. in question,
 - * Additional persons the committee may contact for clarification,
 - * Procedures and/or steps carried out by the person involved prior to submission to the Fair Board.
- When a protest is to be made against the competition or an animal or article in any class, notice of the same must be filed with the Superintendent of the Department before the class is passed upon, that the judge may be instructed to place a reserve award that premiums may be properly distributed in the event of the protest being sustained.

VENDORS

- No person will be allowed to do any soliciting for any paper, merchandise, or articles unless they first obtain permission from the Secretary and pay the required fee.
- Any privilege or concession obtained under false representation will be revoked by the management, and any and all monies paid for the same will be forfeited to the Cass County Agricultural Society.
- Cass County Agricultural Society will not provide 240 volt power to anyone without authorization at the time of rental contract approval.
- Outside vendors with a trailer that is air-conditioned shall also pay a \$25/day camping fee to cover cost of electricity.

PARADE INFORMATION

Parade will be Saturday, August 8th, 6:00 p.m. Parade will form at the north end of the fair grounds. Line-up will be from 4:00 p.m. to 5:45 p.m. Chairman of parade is Miki Bruns. Please call the Fair Office at 402-267-5120 with questions. Parade Entry form is available on www.cassfair.com. Form may be filled out ahead of time and brought with you for line-up but there is no pre-registration. Due to lack of space for line-up, floats will be put in line in the order they arrive and only when all vehicles participating are ready to go. No spaces will be held if a vehicle is not there.

COMMERCIAL BOOTHS AND CONCESSIONS

1. All commercial booths and concessions MUST have reserved space by July 31.
2. For reservations, contact: Fair Board at 402-267-5120 or Meggan Roeber.
3. Specific rules and regulations concerning commercial booths and concessions will be agreed upon between Meggan Roeber and the owner and operator of the booth or concession.
4. Rates for commercial space will be negotiated between the exhibitor and Meggan Roeber.

NEBRASKA STATE FAIR “BEST-IN-COUNTY” RULES

Best in County Quilts: This contest will be part of the Quilt Department and entries will be entered and displayed in the Quilt Hall of the Exhibition Building.

Best in County Textile Arts: This contest will be part of the Textile Arts Department and entries will be entered and displayed in the Fonner Park Concourse, Textile Arts area.

Rules for each contest:

- The exhibitor must be a resident of the county submitting the entry.
- If a second person is involved in the exhibit (i.e. a commercial quilter), that person must be a Nebraska resident.
- If the first place exhibitor declines, an alternate exhibiter may enter.
- The entry in each contest must be one that would qualify to be entered into an existing class in the respective NSF departments. Not all county fair department classes are consistent with state fair department classes (i.e. quilted table runners and some other quilted items are in the Textile Arts Department at the state fair). Review the various classes available in the current year's Quilt and Textile Arts Departments. See Domestic Entry Books at www.statefair.org.
- All entries must comply with all rules of the respective NSF departments.

AKSARBEN FARM FAMILY AWARD

This award is presented by the Aksarben Foundation in partnership with the Nebraska Farm Bureau and the Nebraska Association of Fair Managers. These awards honor the families who have held same family ownership of land for 100 (Pioneer Award) and 150 (Heritage Award) years. To date, nearly 10,000 families in all 93 Nebraska counties have been honored at their respective county fairs. Each farm family honored receives one engraved plaque and one gatepost marker as permanent recognition of their milestone.

Cass County will have families honored again at this year's fair. Check your family records and contact the Aksarben Foundation to apply for either award.

AGE BRACKETS FOR ALL OPEN CLASS DEPARTMENTS, except where noted otherwise:

Participant - 5 years and under
Youth - 6 through 16 years
Adult - 17 years and above

- All entries must be made by the contestant.
- Entry tags may be completed online prior to the fair. Go to www.cassfair.com and click on the "Entry Tags" link. Then, all projects must be entered at the fairgrounds during the appropriate registration / entry times.
- Age Bracket must be indicated on each entry tag. To assist judges, youth should indicate actual age on entry tag.
- Open Class Superintendents and Judges reserve the right to reclassify entries to another Class / Lot / Department, as deemed necessary, and to disqualify them, if needed.
- Contestants must reside in Cass County; if not, the contestant's entry will displayed, however they will receive a participation ribbon and no premium.
- Only one entry permitted per class and lot number, unless noted otherwise.
- The Cass County Fair is committed to being inclusive. There will be special consideration for those with disabilities. Please advise at entry time.

PREMIUMS FOR OPEN CLASS RIBBONS TO BE AWARDED AS FOLLOWS, except where noted otherwise:

Grand Champion - Purple Ribbon with Rosette and \$10.00
Reserve Champion - Lavender Ribbon with Rosette and \$7.00
Best in Class - Purple with \$5.00
First Place - Blue Ribbon with \$3.00
Second Place - Red ribbon with \$2.00
Third Place - White Ribbon with \$1.00

Each lot will be judged for blue, red, and white ribbons. Each class may have a purple ribbon chosen for "Best in Class", if the Judge determines the merit of this placing. After judging is completed, the Grand Champion Ribbon and Reserve Champion Ribbon will be chosen from the Best in Class ribbons.

GENERAL INFORMATION: No entry fee for poultry or rabbits. All exhibitors must provide feed as well as containers for feed and water for each cage. It is the responsibility of all exhibitors to feed and water their rabbits and chickens daily. No premiums will be paid for poultry if cages are not cleaned at the time they are released. Must be inspected by Superintendent to receive premiums. It is illegal to use drugs not approved by USDA in meat animals.

POULTRY

RULES: Only birds of standard breeds will be admitted. Chickens can be shown only as single birds or pens. Pens consist of two (2) females and one (1) male, except egg production. No animals can be shown for more than one premium. Animals showing signs of disease or not presentable will not be admitted. Birds shall not be permitted to enter unless the exhibitor shall, on entering the poultry, sign a declaration that, to the best of his knowledge, the poultry entries and source of flock or flocks are free from any evidence of, and were not recently exposed to, Newcastle disease or any infectious or transmissible disease.
